Dear Normandy Families,
The countdown to spring break has begun! Spring always brings about change and growth, both in nature and in our everyday lives. This is also the case at Normandy. As we look toward the end of this year, we are planning ahead for the 19-20 school year. This includes nominating and electing board members for our PTO and PIE committees. Our PTO serves to build a strong foundation for supporting student and teacher growth, while also providing opportunities for our community to come together for some fun. PTO funds our teacher wish lists, supports professional learning, provides technology for classrooms, nourishes our garden, plans community events, and is a vital part of our school. Normandy's Partners in Education committee reviews school academic data and data concerning our school's climate and culture. PIE also helps plan for programming and provides feedback on decisions concerning the learning and business aspects of our school. Parents are encouraged to partner with Normandy in many capacities. As you consider how you might be involved in the 19-20 school year, I invite you to attend our PTO and PIE meetings to learn more about how you can help our community grow and continue to develop a climate and culture that benefits all students and families.

Another exciting change for the 19-20 school year, is the anticipated adoption of Into Reading from Houghton Mifflin Harcourt Publishing Company. This program is currently going through a rigorous vetting process at the district level. As part of this process, teachers and a parent representative combed through the curriculum with the Curriculum and Instruction department. We looked at the program's diversity, instructional support for all students, and how it complemented with the Colorado Academic Standards. To date, the Curriculum and Instruction and Educational Technology departments have completed their evaluation and have given this curriculum the "green light." Purchasing is working to build contracts with HMH.

Upon our return from spring break, one teacher in every grade level will begin piloting this reading series so that we can evaluate its effectiveness in classrooms. Please look for more information to be posted on our website, as we provide a link for families to use to explore Into Reading more in depth. We are anxious to share this resource with you and look forward to your feedback. If you are interested in looking through the curriculum, we will also have samples in the office for you to peruse. Once the program has been successfully vetted by all departments, it will go to the Board of Education for approval. Our hope is to purchase this resource for the 19-20 school year. This is exciting news for our school!

Your family's experience and each child's success is of utmost importance to me. I look forward to seeing you at all of this month's fun events and community meetings. # Physical Education

This month, not only did we practice good habits to keep our hearts healthy, we also learned dance steps for Tinikling. Tinikling is a cultural dance form the Philippines. It is traditionally performed with bamboo poles, but at Normandy we use PVC pipes. These pipes are moved in rhythm, so that the students can practice dance steps inside and outside of the poles. 1st5th grades, the students learn the steps and perfect them so that in 6th grade they can put all of the steps learned together into a dance routine which is performed for their classmates. Kindergarten was able to watch the 2nd graders learning the steps and will get their chance to try the dance next year in 1st grade.

## Artistic Endeavors

Below is a quick summary of current and future art projects for each grade level.
Kindergarten: Kindergarten has just finished a clay unit and a self-portrait unit. The last trimester Focus will be on storytelling and integrating art with other subjects.

First Grade: First grade is completing a clay animal unit. Following the clay unit they will begin lessons dealing with multiple steps using a printmaking technique and a portrait unit.

Second Grade: They are currently working on a portrait unit inspired by contemporary artist Sandra Silberzweig. This will be followed by a collage landscape unit.

Third Grade: Third grade is beginning their clay unit inspired by ancient illuminated letters and will close out the year with architecture.

Fourth Grade: Currently they are in the beginning stages of a self-portrait unit focusing on tints and shades using a monochromatic scheme.

Fifth Grade: They are working on figural sculptures inspired by the late Swiss sculptor Alberto Giacometti. The rest of the trimester will focus on one and two point perspective.

Sixth Grade: Sixth grade is in the end stages of their clay unit and then will close out the year focusing on creating narrative art.
