Dear Normandy Families,

It has been a while since I shared information about our Unified Improvement Plan for the 18-19 school year. Our Unified Improvement Plan guides our professional learning and is designed to increase student academic achievement over the course of the school year. This year we have three goals:

- To decrease the percentage of kindergarten through 3rd grade students scoring below and well below benchmark by 5% on grade level reading assessments.
- To close the academic growth gap between males and females in the area of math.
- To increase the percentage of students meeting or exceeding expectations in the areas of written knowledge and written expression by at least 5% in grades 4, 5, and 6. The percentage of 3rd grade students meeting or exceeding expectations will increase by 10%.

To reach these goals, teachers have been doing two important things in and out of the classroom. First, they have been active participants in our Professional Learning Community. Each week they use their planning time to prioritize grade level standards and develop learning targets to meet these prioritized standards. Based on their learning targets, teachers collaborate to create assessments that assess for learning throughout their units of study. These assessments allow teachers to pause the teaching cycle so they can re-teach and extend learning as needed. This differentiation meets the individual needs of learners and serves to close the academic gaps amongst student populations. We believe that this work has also given teachers the opportunity to study their craft and to learn from one another. They have used new mentor texts, designed lessons together, and studied their delivery. They also evaluate what practices they want to retain or revise when teaching these units again next year. Additionally, teachers have been incorporating the Jeffco Generations skills into everyday learning in order to increase student engagement, collaboration, rigor, and application of skills. As I spend time in rooms, I have seen students working together to deconstruct mentor text, identify the characteristics of writing genres, and use their new understandings to evaluate their personal writing. In math students are justifying the reasonableness of solutions with peers and applying their learning to the real world. The increase in teacher awareness of the prioritized standards, and their ability to plan for instruction that is centered on student learning, is impressive. I am thankful for the dedicated staff members at Normandy and their commitment to our Professional Learning Community.

As we begin to wrap up the 18-19 school year, I want to highlight a few unique opportunities we have to impact the community around Normandy and to enjoy spending time together. This Friday, we have our Spaghetti and Bingo Night sponsored by our 5th graders. Please make sure to RSVP so that we have enough food for everyone. Information about this event is included at the end of this newsletter. On Saturday, April 20th we have been invited to participate in a day of service to remember those affected



by the Columbine tragedy. There is also more information in this newsletter about how to get involved in this event. Please join us to give back to our neighborhood. Finally, I want to remind all adults to model safe behavior in the Kiss 'N Go. We ask that families use the stoplight to cross the street rather than crossing in other spots along Kendall Blvd. Please model this behavior for students. Several times over the last month we have watched as students cross the street between moving cars in the Kiss "N Go to meet adults. Not only is this unsafe, it is against the law and heart-stopping for our staff. As you are dropping off or waiting for your student(s), please pull forward so that we can serve all families. The Kiss 'N Go is a very busy place and is not a good place to use cell phones. Parents and visitors need to be alert and aware of students as they run toward cars and cross the street. Last, please do not make U-turns along Kendall Blvd. U-turns are illegal in a school zone. Thank you for helping us keep our students safe. It is such a privilege to be a part of the Normandy community. Your child's academic and socialemotional success is of utmost importance to me and my staff. 
Dear Normandy Families,
