

Throughout this month, school community members have two opportunities to provide feedback to Normandy Elementary and Jeffco Public Schools. The Family School Partnership Survey is open through December 14th. This survey provides our school with valuable information regarding our collaborative efforts to ensure success for all students. The survey takes about 10 minutes to complete, and we greatly appreciate your feedback as we plan for the end of this year and the beginning of next year. The second survey is a Jeffco Schools Start Time Survey. The Jeffco Public Schools Start Time Task Force is studying the issue of shifting school start times to better align with the American Academy of Pediatrics recommendation that middle and high schools start no earlier than 8:30 AM in order to increase total hours slept, which is known to improve adolescent physical, mental and cogitative health. This survey should also take about 10 minutes to complete and will be available through December 10th. Please let us know if you have questions about either of these. The links are below.


Dear Normandy Families,

"Eye-hand coordination (also known as hand-eye coordination) is the coordinated control of eye movement with hand movement."

This month the students will be participating in activities which emphasize eye-hand coordination. Pickle ball is a net sport which combines, badminton, tennis, and ping-pong, all in one. Students will be introduced to serving, receiving, rules and regulations, and score keeping. The goal is for the students to progress from learning the skills necessary to play net sports through small-sided games (grades K-4) to actually playing a game against an opponent in singles and mixed doubles (grades 5-6).

This year our Kids Heart Challenge (formerly Jump Rope for Heart) will begin the first week of February and conclude with Rainbow week at the end of the month! More details to follow.....

Once again thank you for such a warm welcome into the Normandy community.


Technology

Artistic Endeavors

The Original Works fundraiser was a success! I do not know the exact numbers yet, but whatever the profits are will go towards a new drying rack as well as other items for the art room.

As the first trimester comes to a close, below is a quick update for each grade in the art room:

Kindergarten will create artwork focusing on shapes using a variety of mediums.

First grade is ending the trimester on storytelling before learning about sequence and patterns in art.

Second grade will end the first trimester with a still life and begin the second trimester creating portraits.

The third graders will finish the first trimester with a triptych painting using color groups and then begin the second trimester with the theme of public art and its importance to a community.

Fourth grade will end the trimester with a 3D abstract sculpture before turning their attention to landscapes.

Fifth grade is learning about the elements that go into making a good composition and will end the trimester with a 3D sculpture that incorporates elements of composition.

Sixth grade is finishing up their amazing metaphorical animal self-portraits and will continue the theme of symbolism in art with a logo lesson based on their initials. Technology will be incorporated into this lesson. This will be followed by a clay memory box.



The <u>Food For Thought BakPak Program</u> is a partnership of businesses, faith-based ministries, and the communities of SW Jefferson County who care about hunger needs of students in our schools.
